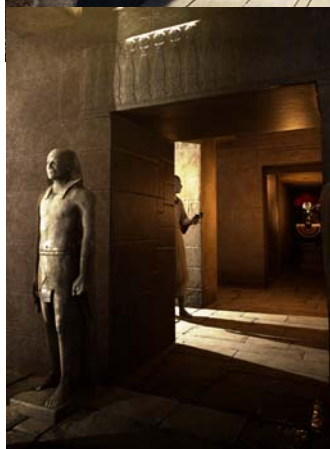

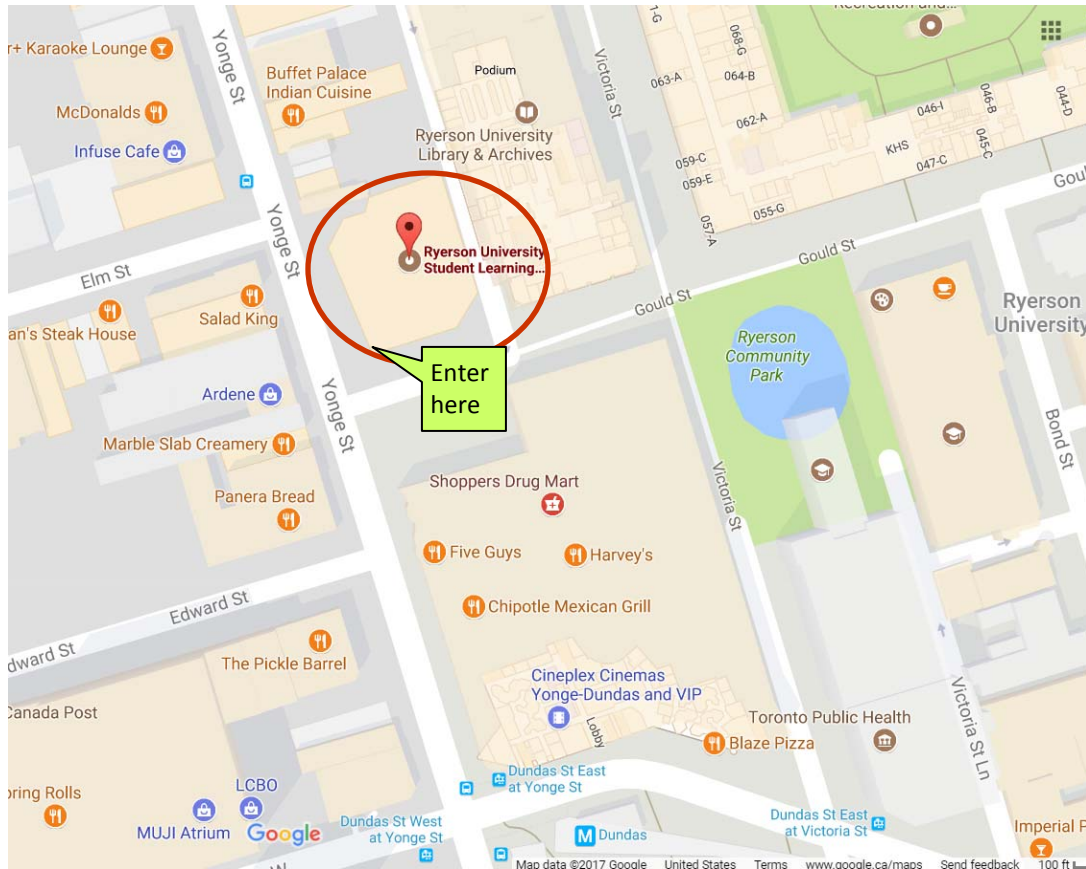
***Virtual Archaeology and Meaning-Making: Aura and Presence through Virtual Reality.***
